1. Who do you take advice from? What makes you trust this person? Based on the circumstances, Simon Peter didn't have to take fishing advice from Jesus, a carpenter. Why do you think he nevertheless listened and obeyed Jesus?

2. In your own words, summarize Luke 5:1-11. What stands out as the heart of the passage? After seeing the enormous catch of fish, how was Simon Peter's response to Jesus significant? How does his response reflect Isaiah's in Isaiah 6:1-5?

3. Jesus turned the fishermen (Peter, Andrew, James, and John) into fishers of men. They were immediately given a glorious mission. What was their response (vs 11)? What were the implications of this mission on their lives?

4. Share a time in your life where you learned to trust Jesus despite unreliable circumstances or a doubtful heart. What was the outcome of the event? How did you learn to trust Jesus more following that event?

5. We were encouraged to think about and pray for one person in our life who is "in the deep", who needs Jesus. Who is this person in your life? How is God working through circumstances to provide you opportunities to share the gospel?
